THE WATER SITUATION IN WEIDMAN IS IN A HIGHLY FLUID STATE AT PRESENT

Ask any resident of Weidman what can and should be done about the Central Michigan Health Department's demand for a public water supply for the village of Weidman and you'll get an answer different from your own opinion and probably different from what others have said.

Some say the Health Department is acting on orders from above, some say the Water Resources Commission, some say the DNR, others have other opinions.

Whatever, there remains the unanswered question of why the Health Department suddenly dropped its plans for a public sewage disposal system for Weidman and its two lakes after President Nixon cut off federal funds for same.

The sewage pollution problem is a real one in Weidman, although not impossible of remedy.

dy. There are places here still putting sewage into the storm drain system, and that empties into the Coldwater River. Probably most of the offenders don't even know they are offending. Places here have changed hands many times, and in the early part of this century dumping sewage into a river was considered the ultimate in efficient disposal.

The Health Department refuses to engage in helping to rectify the situation in Weidman by the relatively easy method of cleaning up what violations we have. The Department assents only to the discussion of a public water supply system, followed, as soon as possible, by a public sewage disposal system, neither of which the village can afford at its present stage of growth.

Some here think we should invest in a public water supply for the village and the two lakes. Some of these are citybred, and don't mind "city water". Some have no idea of the meaning (taste) of "city water". Some believe the cost could be borne by the village.

POWER FAILURE FRIDAY IN WEIDMAN AREA DUE TO BURNED OUT WIRE SPAN

A power failure that began at 11.45 Friday morning and lasted until 2.25 p.m. was due to a span of primary wire which burned out, according to Consumers Power Company in Mt. Pleasant.

The break occurred two spans west of the Gilmore Road on the Weidman Road, Consumers Power said. This was a length of old wire, and was faulty, the comp any said. New primary wire was strung to replace the break, accounting for the twohour-plus loss of electricity in the Weidman area.

Homes were affected up to a mile west of Weidman, and east, of course; and then about half an hour later the power in business places in Weidman went off. No damage was reported.

Peter Lorenz passed away Sunday, Jan. 28, in the Clare Hospital, where he had been a patient. He had suffered ill health for several years. He was 74.



### Editor's Column

Some believe it could not, and they believe that many families on marginal incomes would lose their homes through taxation if a public water system were put in here.

What we personally are puzzled by is the fact that the Health Department says too many people are putting down water wells in the 20 to 28 foot zone of water supply, and there is a "potential" threat of contamination if too many wells are put on this "aquefer".

We can't help wondering why the Health Department doesn't issue an order for no more wells at 28 feet; during a given period, say five years, all new wells must be at 40 feet; aften that five years, all new wells must be put at 60 feet; and so on. It would get the "potential" load off the 28-foot "aquefer"

load off the 28-foot "aquefer". We happen to know that most of the village of Weidman is on an artesian stream, underground water, and that water traveling can purify itself even if it becomes contaminated. We went through that in our own home in the 1940s. We are on an artesian underground. stream at 15 feet, and our water is wonderful, and it tests pure in the Lansing laboratories.

We can only wait and see. One thing Ye Ed is definitely opposed to, and that is the proposition of incorporating the village of Weidman under duress from the Health Department, to make administration of a public water system easier. (Two township boards now control all development destinies of Weidman, and that would be unhandy if two separate boards had to meet and keep a public water system going. Also we understand that townships cannot impose taxation, and there sure would have to be taxation to pay for public water and sewage-disposal systems. In 1966 this paper went all out for incorporation of Weidman as a village.

Not now. Not under these circumstances.
