

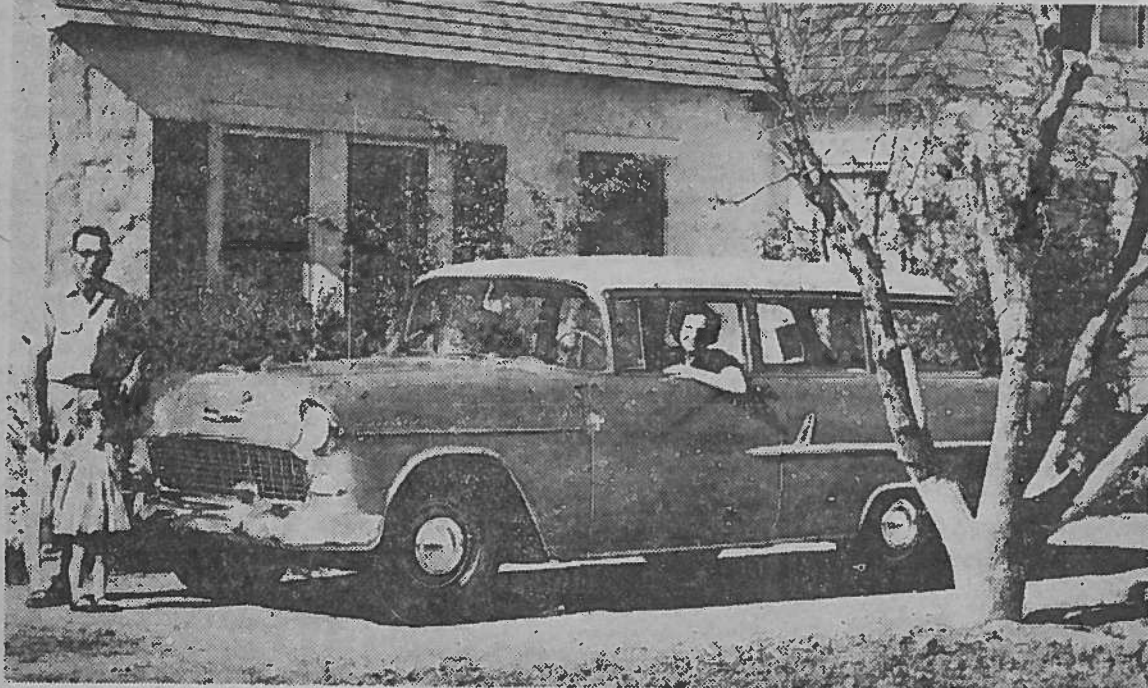

Interest High in Taking Up Oil Leases in This Area

Leasemen representing independent and individual oil interests have been through the Weidman area once more, with Leonard Oil Company taking the lead after Dow's leasing a big block of land near the old Sherman oil field.

Leonard has leased generally through Weidman and out to the Dow holdings west of town, with interest developing to the east of Weidman centering on the old core tests run just west of the cemetery at Weidman. The west edge of Nottawa periodically has been of highest interest to leasing oil companies, and it is of high interest now, with leases being taken up by individuals mainly.

The Dow subsidiary company has indicated it will have a test well down in the Sherman block by fall.

Of highest interest is the statistical material available on formations in the Drallette well, which came in dry in the Dundee but with high formations all the way down; and the reports on the old core tests to the east of town.

In the Gilmore area, the Powell No. 5 was drilling ahead beyond 1300 feet last week, the No. 5 being an offset to the only producer obtained there as yet, the Powell No. 3, on the old Dillon farm. These wells are being drilled on the Gilmore farm. The Gilmore wells are put down by John Neyer and Associates.
