## School Blasted

A midnight blast of dynamite gouged a hole in the ground on the north side of the Beal City High School building Tuesday night, shattering seven windows.

State police were investigating as we went to press. They said that apparently one stick of dynamite was blown, about 45 feet from the front door of the school. It was placed on the cinder path between the high school building and the gym.

Beal City residents were petrified at the explosion, and the sound, and to some, the light of the blast, were heard and seen in Weidman.

Consensus of opinion Wednesday morning seemed to place the outrage as a "youthful prank". The Messenger sincerely hopes the state police locate the culprits.
