McBRIDE--This Cariboo com munity lost one of its oldest and most colorful citizens when Claude Cliff, better known as Shorty, died in Royal Inland
Hospital, Kamloops, after a
brief illness at the age of 78.
Born in Michigan, Shorty Cliffi
came to Canada about the turn

of the century, and hit the Mc-Bride area before the Grand Trunk Railway was built to the Pacific Ocean. When construc-tion began he contracted to do some of the packing with horses.

Always an ardent outdoorsman he trapped until his fatal illness. He also was fond of shoot ing, and was known as a great story-teller.

Shorty was a member of the McBride Farmers' Institute and its first secretary in 1915. He also was a life member of a Masonic Lodge branch in Michigan, founded by his father.
