## Story of the Week

## Millpond Road To Be Rebuilt Soon

The half-mile stretch across the Weidman millpond on the north road will be rebuilt and prepared for blacktopping along with the other four miles north, it was learned from the Road Commission this week.

This is good news for Weidman, as recent plans were for rebuilding and preparing only the four-mile stretch, leaving the half-mile into Weidman as it is.

County Road Engineer Ernest Bruce said this week that gravel will be laid on the four-mile strip first, then work will be begun on the half-mile stretch which includes the millpond road.

Across the millpond, he said, plans are drawn for a 36-foot width road, raised three feet above the present level. At this time he plans to put in one eight-foot half-circle tube to replace the remains of the present bridge there.

Also scheduled for immediate start, according to the Road Commission, is the south

road out of Weidman. Rights of way have been secured to change the direction of the road just south of Frank Thorp's home and follow the old railroad bed, more or less, to meet the south road leading to the Broomfield Township blacktop just south of the Gatehouse farm.

## DHIA Report

WILLIAM BLOCK AND SONS, OWNERS OF HIGHEST HERD, NO. 2 D. H. I. A.

The summary of the records for the No. 2 DHIA for the year ending in April shows Wm. Block and Sons owning the highest producing herd. This herd averaged 470 lbs. of fat for the year with 25 cows. Next in order come George House and Son at 455 lbs. of fat--22 cows; Ron Ervin, 438 lbs. of fat--27 cows; Norman Gross at 419 lbs. of fat--7 cows; Cotter and Bogan, 417 lbs. of fat--23 cows; Ed Schafer, 412 lbs. of fat--10 cows; and Fred McDonald 402 lbs. of fat--22 cows.

The average cow in the Association made 11,180 lbs. of milk and 394 lbs. of fat. Cows were on pasture 146 days. Each

cow consumed 6 1/4 tons of roughage and grain in addition to pasture. Fourteen herds completed the year with 286 cows.

Plans are being made by the Board of Directors to hold their Annual Meeting Wednesday night, May 22.

## DON GROSS GETS FIRST WIN OF SEASON

Don Gross, our local representative of the Major Leagues, pitched at Pittsburg in the second game of a double-header between the Pirates and the Cincinnati Redlegs Sunday afternoon. Don won his game 7-3, giving the Pirates seven widely scattered hits. He also had one RBI and went all the way to gain his first win of the season. This was the fifth game in which Don had pitched but his first starting assignment, as the other appearances were in a relief role.

The young lefty, as hailed by manager Birdie Tebbetts to be one of his brightest pitching prospects, will be Cincinnati's choice as the fourth starting pitcher, as pointed out by the Sporting News. Don won three and lost none last season with the Redlegs and Tebbetts thinks he can be a 15 game winner. The Sporting News also stated that Don has limited his opponents to 18 hits in pitching 23 1/2 innings, has struck out 11 and walked two men. His present record is now 1-0.
