bride is employed at the Credit Bureau, while the bridegroom is employed at the State Home and Training School at Mt. Pleasant.

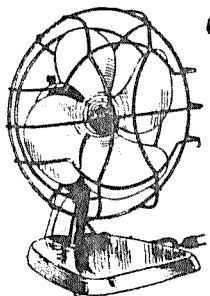
