NEW HOMES GOING UP IN WEIDMAN TOWN

A number of new homes are in the process of building in Weidman at this time.

Besides the Gary St. John home on Airline Road, and the Alton Allen home started on Roe's Acres on Lake of the Hills, the Frank Tvoriks are building an impressive large modern home across from the Walter J. Floss says there will be two other cottages next to her new home, to be built by her children and their families.

Weidman has seen a rash of new-home building the past year, including the Chester Vore home at the entrance to Weidman, which replaced the old building formerly the Hurd home. This alone is an improvement for which we are all thankful.

Adams' Drive-In eat place is doing very well in its second year, and the town has its new restaurant, The Coffee Break, owned and operated by Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Abendroth, also doing very well. Weidman now has a good place to eat in a brand-new building, where food and soft drinks only are served.

Weidman's two taverns also serve food to those who wish it.

One of the most important additions to the town is Pitts' Radio and Tv Sales and Service, in a modernized building and with complete stocks of radios, television sets, and records.

The town is perking up, in advance of its lake developments, which include the Ojibwa Recreation Area, the Searle development of the east side of the Mill Pond, and Allen Lumber Company's Lake of the Hills, also in the village.

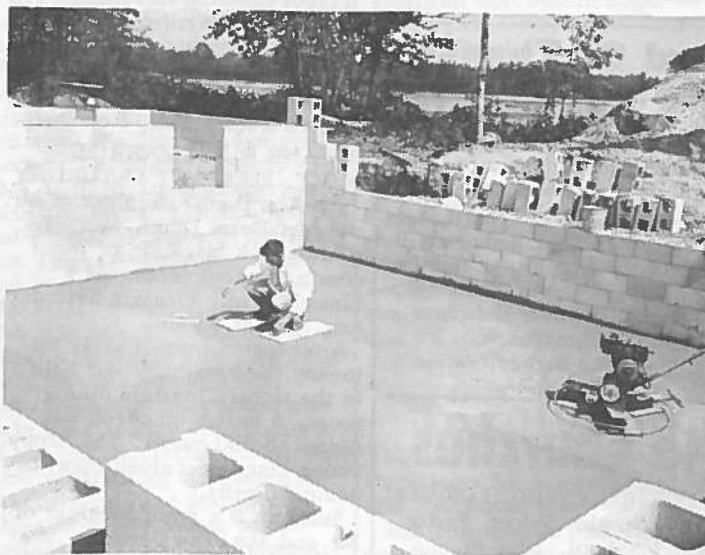
