Weidman School pupils who are deficient in reading abilities have a beautiful new room and a special teacher to help them correct their reading status.

Complete remodeling has been done in one room for these students, with translucent ceiling squares providing indirect lighting, paneled walls, and wallto-wall carpeting.

Their teacher is Miss Aliance Cook, a veteran teacher of the Sixth Grade in this school. Students from grades Three through Eight will be among those taking the reading-remedy classes. Forty-two pupils were tested.

The beautiful new room was remodeled by Allen Lumber Co. Money for the remodeling and the project is provided by the Federal Government. The Weidman School has other projects under Federal aid.

ADMINISTRATORS, SCHOOL BOARDS ENDORSE HUGE MERGER OF DISTRICTS

(Editor's Note: The following article was brought to the Messenger office Tuesday morning by Weidman School Superintendent Ralph Turnbull, with an urgent demand that it be published in the paper this week.)

The Boards of Education and administration of the Mecosta-Remus, Barryton, Fouts and Weidman Schools have given their approval and heavily endorse the Mecosta-Osceola-Weidman reorganization plan which will be voted on at a special school election scheduled Saturday, Feb. 11.

The plan which was prepared by an 18 member committee composed of people selected throughout the three-county area and approved by the State Committee on School District Reorganization, calls for the merger of the Mecosta-Remus, Barryton, Fouts and Weidman school districts into one kindergarten through twelfth grade school district.

The plan is the result of over a year of study and preparation, involving many people throughout Mecosta, Osceola and Isabella Counties, and it is the concensus of the administrators and school boards of the school districts involved that the plan as presented will offer a much greater educational opportunity for all the children in this area.

It is the feeling of these people that only through the formation of a larger high school unit, with an adequate tax base, can we provide the stability and necessary curriculum and other educational opportunities which the children in the now smaller unit need and must have in order to meet the challenges and competition of today's society.

The Barryton, Fouts, Mecosta-

The Barryton, Fouts, Mecosta-Remus and Weidman districts will ballot on this proposal as a combined unit. Any persons residing in the districts involved in this merger who are not registered with their township clerks must do so prior to 5 p.m. Jan. 12 in order to be eligible to vote in this election.

All registered voters are eligible to vote at this election and we, the representatives of the following schools urgently request and solicit your support on this very vital and important issue.
