WEIDMAN AGAIN WILL ATTEMPT TO INCORPORATE

At a meeting of the Weidman Business Association at The Coffee Break Restaurant Monday eve ning, it was decided to attempt incorporation of the village once more. An attempt two years ago was defeated by one vote.

Present to advise the members was Attorney Steve Fox of Mt. Pleasant, who did the legal work for the WBA in the former attempt.

Mr. Fox said the first hurdle is approval by the Isabella County Board of Supervisors, who by law decide whether or not to set an election date for such procedures.

A population census will have to be taken again, which is the first step. Mr. Fox will handle the legal paperwork in the present attempt.

Careful delineations of outside map will be considered, with approval of landowners in these areas obtained before the map is officially laid out.
