WHEN "PRANKS" BECOME CRIME, WE HAVE NO SYMPATHY FOR THE DOERS

During this past week, three wreckers of mailboxes were sentenced to replace 60 boxes and spend their nights in jail until the job was completed, which was Monday noon.

One of the three was 26 years old, and deserved a stiffer sentence, in our opinion.

One was 17 years old, married, and the other was 19 years old, unmarried. All were Weidman residents.

In some areas such doings are considered "pranks" by parents and some authorities, but we do not agree. When "pranks" become malicious destruction jobs, then we are pleased to see a law man such as the Shepherd justice who sentenced the Weidman wreckers, hand out a stiff sentence.

Teenagers do not need to go on wrecking rampages for amusement. Today's teens have more of everything given them than any other generation that ever lived.

#### A BIG BEAR IN THE WEIDMAN AREA

Lawton Jesse, who recently purchased the Marie Griffin 40 acres northeast of town from Allen Lumber Company, reports bear tracks through his fields, big tracks, over four inches across, and the loss of a dozen hens from his henhouse in the past few weeks.

When he discovered the tracks, throughout a corn field, rains had partly obscured them, but they were definitely the tracks of a good-sized bear. He figures the bear came to his place from the north, according to tracks, and in all probability returned to the area of what is known as the big swamp lands along the township line between Sherman and Coldwater and Nottawa and Gilmore; in other words, the big swampland just to the north of Weidman.

Bears are hungry when they come out of hibernation in the spring, woodsmen tell us, and will eat most anything. The chickens Mr. Jesse lost were apparently taken one by one, their feathers littered along a lane leading toward the swamplands. After discovering the feathers, and the loss of his hens, Mr. Jesse kept his henhouse door shut at night, and had no more hen losses.

It is most unusual for a bear to come so close to Weidman. It

# **Beal City Election Set**

BEAL CITY - School district voters will be asked to approve a request for 13 mills at the June 12 school election. The millage includes five renewed mills and eight new mills.

Superintendent of Schools Carl Mays told the Times-News the eight new mills would raise about \$44,000, most of which would go for instruction costs.

Mays said the school has raised its base teacher salary from \$4,800 to \$5,900. In addition, Mays said, the school plans to hire four more teachers next vear.

The school would then have a total of 20 teachers employed. Mays said he estimates the school's enrollment will jump from 389 to 460 next fall.

The school has an operating budget of \$160,635 for the 1966-67 school year. The estimated budget for the 1967-68 school year is \$221,610.

In addition to the hike in instructional costs, other operating costs are expected to raise. The transportation and services allotment for 1966-67 is \$31,200. This is estimated to increase to \$42,300 for 1967-68.

The capital outlay is also estimated to increase from this year's \$4,000 to \$8,500.

Mays said the added millage is needed for other general operations as well.

The present five-mill levy will expire in this month.

Voters will also be balloting June 12 on two members to the school board, each for four year erms.

Incumbents Victor Pohl and Frank Schafer are running unopposed for the board terms.
