Obituary FRANK GROSS

Frank Gross died Tuesday morning, July 30, at CMC Hospital in Mt. Pleasant, after an illness. He was 78.

He was born Dec. 13, 1890, in Sturgis, and came to Isabella County at age four when his parents took up a farm in Broomfield township.

When he was nine years old his parents moved to Weidman, living on what is now school property, at the west end of the School Road.

March 22, 1910 he was united in marriage to Bertha Shurlow, and the young couple lived in Jennings, Mich., where Frank worked in a shingle mill. They lived in Mt. Pleasant, where he worked for Gorham Bros. 56 years

A son, James, was born in Mt. Pleasant. The family moved back to Jennings, where the second son, worth and family of Holt were Ernest, was born.

In 1913 they moved back to Weidman to stay. Frank was manager of the pickle factory here from 1940 to 1965. He worked for the Libby Company over 50

years.


