WEIDMAN LIBRARY PROGRESSES IN PLANS FOR AFFILIATION AND USE

Mrs. Diane Benn consulted with the new librarian, Mr. Hanson, at the Mt. Pleasant Public Library last week, on possibilities for affiliation and getting the new Weidman Library into use.

Mr. Hanson suggested that those directly connected with the proposed library here attend a meeting with Miss Jacquet and Mrs. Lindsay, State Library consultants for this area, at the Mt. Pleasant Public Library on Thursday, Dec. 18, at 8 p. m. This is not a public meeting.

Personnel directly concerned with our proposed Public Library here includes such people as Mrs. Benn, members of the Township Boards of the area, Leon McArthur, who bought and donated the property for the library, and volunteer librarians. Mrs. Benn will send cards to these people in the near future.

Mr. Hanson also advised that the Weidman Public Library become a branch of the Mt. Pleasant Public Library, so it could use the facilities of the Coe Township Library and automatically become a member of the Chippewa Library League (no relation to Chippewa Hills Schools). This would give a large variety in library materials, and also would help in contributing some necessary supplies for library use.

Mrs. Benn received a letter from the State concerning a workshop for a school librarian to be able to work in a public library, and at present no workshops have been scheduled for the winter.

However, if the Weidman Public Library becomes a branch of the Mt. Pleasant Library, volunteer librarians may have been teachers with a degree in library science, or having been teachers in a school system.

Mr. Behnke, recreational director of the Chippewa Hills School District, has said he wants a Story Hour for pre-schoolers. It has been suggested that our new Public Library would be an excellent place to hold a Story Hour, being more centrally located than the school building. More information on this is expected to be worked out later.

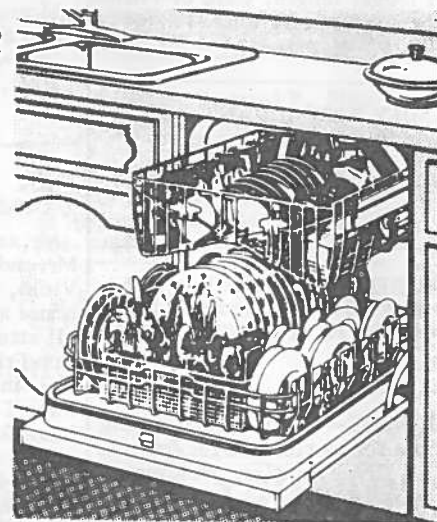

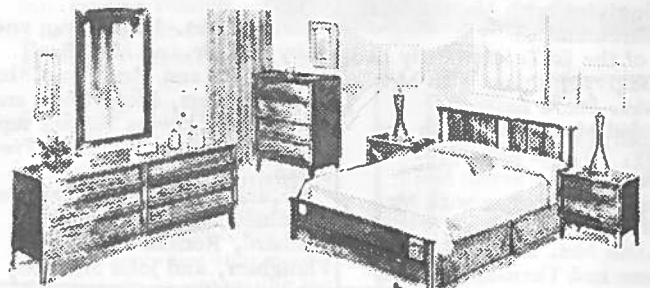


