TO DO GOOD ... QUIETLY Raymond Shook has always been a quiet man; quiet in his priceless humor, in his tenaceous beliefs, in his desire to help other people.

We have never forgotten the courage it must have taken for him to come to our house one time when all the town believed no one should come.

In 1950 Paul Roe died unexpectedly in Middleville, Mich. where he and his sisters, Allys and Connie, were in partnership in owning and publishing the Middleville Sun.

Paul died; suddenly, and, we have always believed, unneces-sarily. We were literally crushed.

At that time, Allys Roe dis-covered that she had an incurable cancer.

Minnie Roe, then in her 80's, and Allys and Connie, brought Paul home to Weidman for burial But before we came back to the old town and the old home, we telephoned ahead, asking for one day of complete privacy so we could attempt to pull ourselves together before meeting sympathetic friends here.

The message was misunderstood and word went around Weidman that the Roes did not want to see anyone, period.

On the second day we'd been here, Raymond Shook came to our door and said, "They say you don't want anybody coming here, but I'm here to ask just one question: Can I do anything to help you?"

He was in our house thirty seconds. But he left a lasting impres sion of his dignity, his courage, and his compassion for others.
