VOTERS TURN DOWN SCHOOL MILLAGE REQUEST

Voters of the huge Chippewa Hills School District turned down two millage proposals by approximately three to one percentage in Tuesday's school election.

About 35 percent of the district's voters went to the polls.

A request for 7 mills additional

for operating expenses lost by a vote of 1,026 No, 329 Yes, according to first reports.

A 5-mill levy for building and site purposes in a sinking fund also lost heavily, 979 No votes to 364 Yes.




