The interior of the Weidman Public Library is shaping up, due to the constant work of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Benn, two young dynamos in civic endeavor.

Help has been gratefully accepted from anyone going to the Library Building on Saturdays.

Last Saturday all the walls were given their first coat of paint, four sets of wall shelves built, and Mr. Benn began work on construction of a checkout desk. He has only the top yet to finish. Ceiling insulation is installed and ceiling tile will be put on as soon as shipment of a couple more bundles of tile arrive.

Needed now are enamel for painting bookshelves, and some kind of commercial carpet for the cement floor of the building.

Many willing donations have been made by area people: The purchase of the building by Leon McArthur and gift of it to the proper authority for the Library; Gifts of money, including substantial amounts personally from Rev. and Mrs. Lawrence Smith;

The Pickwick Store in Mt. Pleasant last week donated about \$500 worth of new books, many of the children's books, and all very excellent works.

Other gifts include two six-foot reading tables from Coe Township, lumber from Jim Palmer and Baumann's IGA Store, the heating stove from Leila Shook, a fuel tank from Dick Curtiss, and other gifts we have failed to list.

Electrical wiring is yet to be done, further shelf-building is slated, and the ceiling tile to be installed when it arrives, and re-hang doors so they will open outward.

It is confidently expected that the Library will be in full operation before spring. Most of the construction work is scheduled to be completed by the end of January, so operation of the Library may be much sooner than spring.

Bernard Pitts donated latex paint for the interior, and Fox Hardware donated fluorescent lights for the building.
