JOHN L. FOREST SEES MINE POLLUTION OF LAKE SUPERIOR ON HIS VACATION TRIP

John L. Forest returned last Thursday at 10.30 p.m. from a vacation trip on the circle route around Lake Superior, which he had taken before and wanted to catch up on side trips and sights he had missed.

He reported that the pollution of Lake Superior by the Reserve Mining Company was "totally sickening".

From the top of Lake Superior, he said, to Silver Bay there is beautiful scenery on land, but "black gunk" in Lake Superior's waters turning to a sickening gray film along the route.

Reserve Mining Company is the only mining outfit that dumps its "tailings" into water, John said; other mining companies use the "tailing" method to extract taconite, an ore producing low-grade iron, but dump the tailings on land areas.

John said that Reserve Mining dumps 67,000 tons of tailings or waste into Lake Superior per day.

"It is only a matter of a short time till the beautiful waters of our largest and loveliest Great Lake are ruined for fish life and human use," he said.

John ran through three road construction areas, in the midst of beautiful scenery. "Every mile of road-construction travel seems like 50," John said.

He visited Thunder Bay, Ont., the grain shipping port for Canadian wheat. Eleven-millionbushel-capacity grain elevators stretch for miles along the route, he said.

"I was glad to get away from home, but I'm always just as glad to get back," John said.

He showed us a Saturday, April 4, 1936, EXTRA! edition of the Detroit Free Press describing in detail the execution of Bruno Richard Hauptman for the kidnap and murder of the Lindbergh baby. He found the collector's item in an old brass-bound trunk of his mother's in a storage shed on his place.
