### WE SALUTE THE YOUNG HERE WHO WANT TO HELP OTHERS

There are young people in our town and area who are earnestly desirous of helping--personally, mind you!--other youngsters in need of friendship, listening ears, and supervision of sports activities outside the school.

We salute these earnest young folks. They are of the "younger generation," true; but they claim and we agree that there is no "generation gap" if young want to communicate with old or old want to communicate with young.

We offer the following letter to the editor in explanation of this latest manifestation of the dedication of some of our young people--in this case, a 19-year-old girl. Here's her letter:

Each Tuesday night at the Weidman gym, the Girls' Recreation, also known as the Girl Trotters, hold their weekly meetings which consist of a business meeting and sports activities.

The Girls' Recreation was formed because of one very concerned mother whose daughter and her friends wanted to enjoy sports but were lacking the supervision and the facilities.

In July, Betty Baxter, who was coaching a women's softball team, was contacted by the concerned mother, and she agreed to form and coach a young girls' softball team, whereupon they played scrimmage games with neighboring schools. These are girls age seven to 14.

They carried this program into fall and winter activities. They had a yard sale and bake sale to raise money for their T-shirts.

We understand one of this communities' activities (Brownie Scouts) was discontinued because of lack of parental concern.

Why? Was it lack of interest and help from the parents, or was it misunderstanding by the parents for the need of this very-youthful organization?

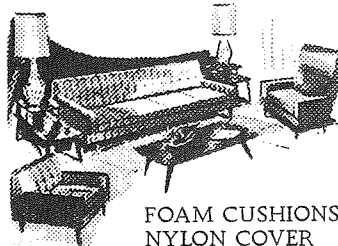

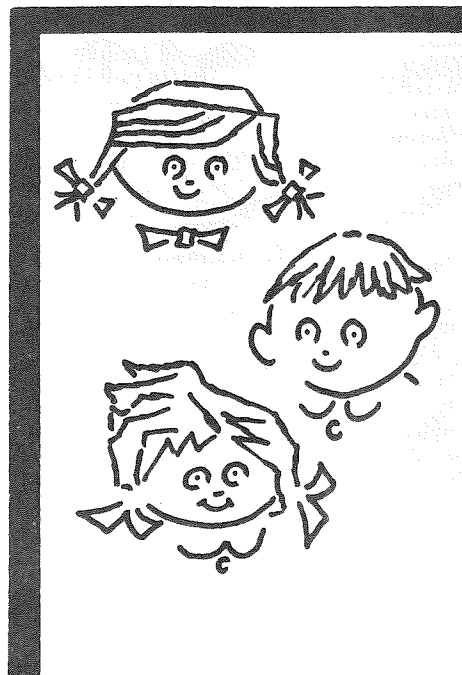
