Apparently people like that. We like it, too.

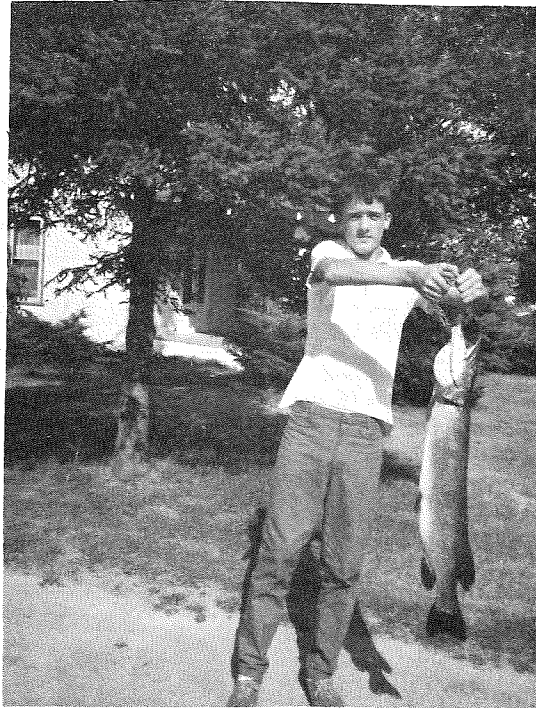
And here we offer a Thank You to the June and July subscribers who started with us in 1964 and have renewed promptly every year.

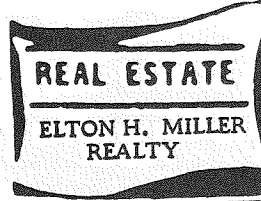

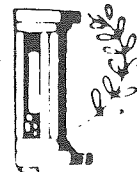

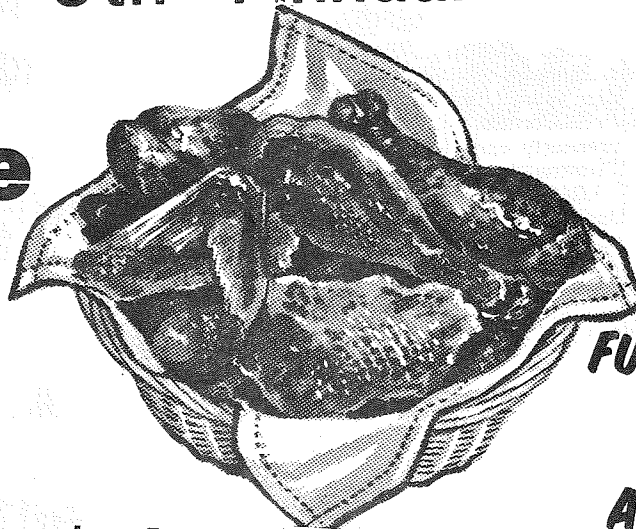
