First prize was won by Lillian Zeien, second by Clara Fox, with the first prize for men going to Jerome Young and second to


Isadore Schafer.

BARNEY TRANBARGER DIED SUNDAY -- At CMC Hospital, where he had been a patient since Jan. 25. He had been in failing health for some time. He and Frances owned and operated The Flower Shop on West Airline Road for the past 19 years.

Up to the past summer, Barney was an active gardener, always raising big amounts of vegetables and strawberries. He helped on the preparation of wedding and funeral flowers in the Flower Shop business.

He was one of the original little group of Weidman business men who founded the Weidman Business Association back in 1948, and tied with Ed Fox in the vote for first president. A coin was tossed, and Ed Fox became president and Barney Tranbarger vice-president.

The old WBA got us our Nottawa and Sherman Township Volunteer Fire Department, among other things, and the Mitchell Memorial Park.

So far as we know, Ed Fox is now the only remaining business man in Weidman who was part of that original small group who worked so hard to establish the WBA and get the first benefits for the town of Weidman.

Byron Herschel Tranbarger was born Jan. 9, 1890, in Cicero, Ind., and spent his life as an. accountant, mainly in Kokomo,

Ind., before coming to Weid-

Nov. 25, 1937, he married Frances Roe in the Roe home in Weidman and the couple made their home in Kokomo.

He was a life member of the Masonic Lodge, and a member of the Elks Club of Kokomo; also a member of the Methodist Church in Tipton, Ind.

When failing eyesight made his work as accountant impossible, they came to Weidman. They established The Flower Shop in September of 1953.

Survivors, besides his wife, include a son and daughter by a previous marriage, John of Los Gatos, Calif., and Mary Wilson of Portland, Ore.; four grandchildren, Tammy and Timmy Tranbarger of Los Gatos, Calif., William Wilson, Jr., of Grand Rapids, and Kathy Munoz of Encinitas, Calif.; and three greatgrandchildren.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at 1 o'clock from the Crittenden Funeral Home in Remus, with Rev. Marvin Eldridge officiating.




