Editor's Column

By Connie WE VOTE ON SCHOOL ISSUES NEXT MONDAY

So next Monday, June 14, we go to the polls and vote on the various candidates for Board membership and a 15-mill request by the school for operation the coming years.

The millage request is peculiarly worded, composed of two ballots: One asking for 12 mills for three years and one ballot asking for three mills for one year.

There will be three ballots: One for three mills added taxes, one for 12 mills taxes, and one for election of two Board of Education members.

Here are the eight candidates running for those two seats on the Board, both three-year terms:

Dr. E.H. Kowaleski, Remus, incumbent; Ivan Allen, Weidman; Neil White, Barryton; Gale Krueger, Broomfield; Carolyn Gilman, Coldwater; Daryl E. Willett, Mecosta; Virginia Woodruff, Mecosta; Dick Shanahan, Mecosta.

Taxpayers in Isabella County are particularly sensitive after Gem Survey got through with us. Isabella County taxpayers had their property valuations multiplide by three to ten times that set by the State Equalization Board, which we thought was very high.

The Chippewa Hills Schools Board of Education would do well to look to proper and economical expenditures of tax monies. Taxpayers have had it.

We are willing to pay for education, even "Space Age" education, as one fond mother thinks her children are getting in the Chippewa Hills Schools; but we do object to unnecessary spending of our hard-earned tax dollars.



In the Editor's Mail

Why did those pushing consolidation promise that construction of a central high school would mean increased employment for people in the school district? Granted, a very few nominal-paying jobs were created. Why, even Mr. Jorgensen's wife was given a job as playground supervisor.
Why was a contract for

\$175,000 given to an outside firm for landscaping the grounds and sodding for the football field when many farm people from this district could have done the same job equally well, thus spending the money in the district which is providing the money?

Quoting from the Chippewa Hills Courier-Shopper, April 8, 1971: "No Winners at Chippewa Hills": "One of the attempts by the school district was to build a new school capable of housing all students in the district, and at the same time eliminating some of the problems and duplication which now exist because of the utilization of many different facilities. Although the idea is attractive, and there isn't really any alternate measure, the people of the school district overwhelmingly defeated a millage two weeks ago which would permit the new school to open next fall." (Written by James Wojcik, editor of the Mt. Pleasant Daily Times-News.)

Mr. Wojcik was obviously misled, as was this school district, and by the same source of information. We still have the duplication, and instead of the expense of four schools we now have the expense of five schools, transportation, and a school administration with their heads buried in Utopia, far removed

from reality.

The school board evidently has some guilt feelings regarding the sacrifice of basic educational needs for frivolous non-essential programs. This is manifested by their latest addition to the curriculum of a "bachelor survival course", which, freely translated, tells male students, "You bumbling idiots won't survive in society one week after graduation, so we shall teach you how to press your pants and shirts, boil water, heat up a tv dinner, and a ready-mix cake formula."

According to the minutes of the school board meeting of September, 1970, it was approved by the school board to allow Mr. Jorgensen to borrow \$127,000 from the Central Michigan Bank. The board, however, does not deem it necessary to explain to the public the use for which this money is intended.

Several months after spending over \$100,000 for architectural blueprints, the board approved spending \$40,000 for installation of a central vacuum system, implying this was some modern innovation. The schools in Detroit were using this system over 40 years ago. What type of administration does not have the foresight to include this in the planning of a new school, especially where they are going to install ultra special carpeting which supposedly has a life of 30 years. Keep in mind that any ultra, ultra carpeting also has an ultra, ultra cost. Mr. Jorgensen, although maintaining how much cheaper is its maintenance, never divulged how much more it cost to purchase

Why does the school board insult the voters by, as they word it in the minutes of their meetings, "approve the payment of \$129,753 for current bills and payrolls," without a breakdown and separation of the payroll and current bills? The figures above are takenfrom the May 11, 1971, minutes. This infers you have no right to know where your money is being spent or how. Current bills, for example, should be broken down in detail. Any City Commission or Village Council does this. Why then does this administration ignore required procedure? Perhaps they feel you are too ignorant to add 2 plus 2. In any event, it is a direct insult to the intelligence of the residents of this school district, who are being asked to pay these bills. If this is their attitude, then they should be replaced as their terms expire.
