MAN DIES IN HOUSE FIRE ON WEST JORDAN ROAD

Herbert Fisk died last Thursday morning when fire damaged his home on West Jordan Road in Southwest Sherman Township.

The fire was discovered by a neighbor at 7.05 a.m., and the Nottawa and Sherman Volunteer Fire Department was called.

Volunteer fire fighters carried Mr. Fisk from the house and administered artificial resuscitation.

A county deputy sheriff applied external cardiac massage, but Mr. Fisk was pronounced dead at the scene by ambulance officials from CMC Hospital.

Death was attributed to smoke inhalation. The cabin was not seriously damaged.



credit for the program.

The Chronicle said, "Jan Louisell's enthusiasm and knowledge is evident when she talks about all the programs at Spring Lake, and that makes Tom Hickman a pretty lucky athletic director."
